

The Ordinances – Baptism & Lord's Supper

God wants us to have a good memory:

- Psalm 77:11 (NIV) "I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago."
- 1 Chronicles 16:12 (NIV) Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced.

Deuteronomy 6:10–13 (NIV)- 10 When the LORD your God brings you into the land he swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you—a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build, 11 houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves you did not plant -- then when you eat and are satisfied, 12 be careful that you do not forget the LORD, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. 13 Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name.

The Lord Jesus mandated two ordinances: Believer's Baptism and the Lord's Supper. Though not the means of salvation, these ordinances testify of the gospel.

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Participating in these ordinances doesn't do anything for you regarding your salvation.

They <u>"testify of the gospel"</u> → symbolically remind us that Jesus Christ lived, died, and rose again from the dead so that we could be reconciled to God.

1. The Ordinance of Believer's Baptism Baptism

We believe that the New Testament clearly prescribes baptism for believing disciples as a symbol and proclamation of the believer's death to sin and resurrection to new of life. Further we believe and practice immersion as the mode of baptism prescribed by the New Testament in accordance with its word meanings, examples, and symbolism.

Matthew 28:19-20 Acts 2:38; 8:12 Romans 6:3

1. The Ordinance of Believer's Baptism Baptism

Jesus.

- a one-time public declaration of a person's faith and trust in Christ
- a visual aid of our salvation and identification with Christ Baptism is points to the death, burial, and resurrection of

Matthew 28:19 (NIV) - "Therefore GO and make disciples of all the nations...

...<u>baptizing them</u> in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Ephesians 2:8–9 (NIV) - 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast.

Acts 2:41 [ESV] - "Those who accepted his message were baptized."

Acts 16:30-34 (NIV) - "'Sirs, what must I do to be saved?' And [Paul & Silas] replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved - you and your household." "Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house...and immediately he and all his family were baptized...and he was filled with joy because he had come to believe in God – he and his whole family.

The Condition for baptism is being <u>saved</u> through faith and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation.

b. The Command About Baptism

Every Christian should be baptized.

Matthew 28:19–20 (NIV) ¹⁹ GO therefore and make disciples of all nations, <u>baptizing them</u> in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and <u>teaching them</u> to obey everything I have commanded you.

Baptism is a command for believers in Christ to respond to in obedience.

c. The Confession of Baptism

Baptism illustrates our identity with Christ.

Romans 6:1-4 (NIV) What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? 2 By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? 3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

2. The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper The Lord's Supper

We believe that our Lord and Saviour clearly prescribed for His believing disciples the solemn rite of the Lord's Supper as a memorial of the Lord's death to be kept by His disciples until He comes again, according to His promise and the Father's revealed plan.

1 Corinthians 11:23-27 Luke 22:19-20

2. The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper

1 Corinthians 11:26 (NIV) ...whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Jesus: the bread and the cup represented his body and blood that ushered in the new covenant.

2. The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper

Jeremiah 31:31–34 (NIV) 31 "The time is coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah... 33 "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. 34 No longer will a man teach his neighbor, or a man his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

The New Covenant:

- knowing God more intimately through his Spirit living in those who put their faith in him
- being obedient to God's will from the heart
- experiencing forgiveness
- The Lord's Supper proclaims Christ's death & resurrection.

It's important that only believers participate.

We are to participate "in a worthy manner"

- come with humble hearts
- examining our own lives
- confessing sin and seeking forgiveness
- having thankful hearts for what Jesus did for us
